Job Description:

The purpose of this position is to assist in wetland, forestry and wildlife-related fieldwork, including timber inventories, wildlife census data gathering, timber sale oversight and supervision, boundary delineation and timber marking, as well as data collection, environmental inventory and natural resource assessments, including wetland, threatened and endangered species, and other biological needs.

This position will primarily focus on fieldwork and data gathering; however, report writing and data interpretation may also play a key role. Flexible working hours with task-based projects and independent time management will be required.

Housing is available and possible travel with overnight stay may be associated with specific jobs.
